Ukrainians are already rebuilding their country, and Lithuania advocates that like-minded partners support their efforts in reconstructing critical and socially sensitive infrastructure now. To demonstrate its commitment, Lithuania was one of the first countries to start reconstruction projects on the ground and has significantly strengthened its organizational capacities to develop and manage more initiatives in the future. We want to leverage our experience and invite public and private actors to reach out with ideas for joint efforts in Ukraine.

School renovation in Borodyanka town

Beneficiary: Borodyanka Settlement Council
Budget: 7.9 million EUR (of which 1.8 million EUR contribution of Taiwan)
Timeframe: planned to be opened by the end of 2023
Capacity: 700 children



School of the future in Ukraine: preparation of a typical technical project

Partner: State Agency for Restoration and Development of Infrastructure of Ukraine & Architects Association of Lithuania
Budget: ~500 thousand EUR
Timeframe: November 2024
Goal: to prepare a high-quality standard technical design school project that meets the interests and needs of Ukrainian society via international architectural competition



Strengthening administrative capacities of the Ukraine's Agency for Restoration

Partner: State Agency for Restoration and Development of Infrastructure of Ukraine
Budget: ~300 thousand EUR
Timeframe: July 2024
Goal: to strengthen the Agency's public procurement, internal control and anti-corruption procedures in line with the EU pillar assessment methodology

Construction of the mobile residential settlement in Borodyanka

Beneficiary: Borodyanka District Administration
Budget: ~1 million EUR
Timeframe: March 2023
Capacity: 36 families



Modeling and design of the electricity distribution network in Mykolaiv

Beneficiary: AT "Mykolaivoblenergo"
Budget: ~226 thousand EUR
Timeframe: August 2023
Goal: to modernize Ukraine's electricity network taking it as close as possible to the EU standards



Kindergarten renovation in Irpin town

Beneficiary: Irpin District Administration
Budget: 4.9 million EUR (of which 1.2 million EUR contribution of Taiwan)
Timeframe: August 2023
Capacity: 400 children

What's next?

Lithuania is eager to work with the reconstruction projects that will directly and immediately affect the life quality of Ukrainians. In close consultations with our Ukrainian partners, we are constantly working on projects' pipeline for implementation with other international partners. Currently, we are curious to explore partnerships in the fields of energy, critical and socially sensitive infrastructure, education, rehabilitation, and reintegration of veterans.
